Leader of the Week





Aurea Cooper Behavioral Health

June 21-22, 2023, the youth from each program pathway participated in the Leadership Excellence training. The OMJ Readiness Seal is very important for our youth as it is one of the graduation requirements that show the state of Ohio these youth are the professionals the world needs. In our classroom requirements, we are implementing "themes of the week" to coincide with the skills the youth need to master to receive the seal. This week's theme is:

"Teamwork/Collaboration."
